Teachers and Higher Level/Senior Teaching Assistants have also undertaken work scrutiny sessions aimed at celebrating the work of pupils and identifying important next steps in their learning. These processes have been supported by school improvement officers and members of the Governing Body.

I would like to thank all members of the school community for their patience with this situation.
